

The inauguration and orientation program marked the beginning of a new academic year for NSS, and the volunteers are eager to engage in various social service activities and make a positive impact in the community.






















Report on Campus Cleaning Activity by NSS Volunteers







































Report on Blood Donation Camp





Feedback:





7. Closing Ceremony (12.02.2025)


- A valedictory function was held in the presence of Hon. Vaibhavkaka Nayakawadi where village leaders, volunteers, and faculty shared their experiences.
- The village representatives expressed gratitude for the efforts of the NSS team.


Conclusion:




